Focus on Excellence

Year 1 's curriculum was much enhanced by a trip to Compton Verney last week as part of their Castles topic. The children enjoyed a variety of activities based on life in Tudor times. They explored boxes of Tudor artefacts which gave insight into the lives of the people of the times and

developed their thinking skills.

Portraits of King Henry VIII and Elizabeth I were examined and the children were encouraged to look closely and consider what they could learn about these monarchs by the way they dressed and the image they presented. A highlight of this session was getting some of the adults to dress in costumes of the time and pose for observational drawings. In the afternoon experts from the learning centre demonstrated how to draw portraits and use watercolour paints.
