Governor Focus

As sports day was held this week and the country is currently enjoying Wimbledon and a certain football tournament it seemed a good time to mention that governors have oversight of and monitor what the school does with the PE and sports premium funding it receives. Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil. This funding must be used to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport on offer. There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across: the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity; the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement; increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport; broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils; and increased participation in competitive sport.
