In the news recently, you may have seen reports about the effects of playing the online game, Fortnite. Please be aware of the following research information and keep your children safe online.

Fortnite has a PEGI rating of 12 years: this means the game is unsuitable for children under the age of 12

Fortnite's text chat function allows anyone to talk to the gamer (NSPCC)

The 'feel good factor' and feeling of reward when playing Fortnite is thought to be addictive: research and experiments have found brain patterns alter drastically during play of Fortnite

1 in 4 (25%) of children have been contacted by someone they don't know when playing popular games (O2, NSPCC) Remember to talk to your child regularly about how they feel before, during and after gaming. Also, as a family, agree rules and times for gaming and stick to them.


No brown option on this day


