Dear Parents and Carers.

It has been great to see so many of you at the curriculum meetings held this week: I hope you have found the information useful and feel more confident about how to support your children's learning this year. As I have mentioned previously, the big push for this year is in maths and reading. A challenge for our school community is to change the way we sometimes perceive maths as a difficult subject and I am keen for us all to model positive conversations about maths and the use of numbers in our everyday lives. If we can embrace a positive approach towards maths and problem solving, not only will we be helping our own children but we will be helping to change some outdated attitudes towards maths and numbers in general.

Reading is also incredibly important and I would encourage everyone to try to set some quality time aside to share a book or a story with their children every day or as often as possible. Reading and the discussion of what has been read, is crucial in the development of vocabulary and understanding and there has been a lot of research to show that increasing a child's vocabulary improves their capacity for learning. Our capacity to learn is expandable and the 'size' of our vocabulary is a good indicator of cognitive development so if you want to help your child to become a genius then learning and understanding more words is a very good start
