Dear Parents and Carers

One of our key areas for development this year has been in maths. Consequently, we have made a number of changes to our maths curriculum, including the introduction of a '6 part' maths lesson. The children have been making excellent progress and have spoken very positively about how they are learning mathematical concepts and applying these skills in 'real-life' situations which is the best way to assess whether they really understand. The focus on maths has given us a great opportunity to work with other partners to share great ideas and practise.

This week we gave parents the opportunity to visit some of our maths lessons and it was great to see parents in lessons learning alongside their children. The feedback we received was fantastic: one parent said; "Great opportunity to see teaching in action. Brilliant engaging teaching" and another; "Fantastic way to see how you teach maths and learn. We can now better support them and got a glimpse of classroom life. Thank you for the opportunity"

One parent rightly identified that this does create extra pressure for the teachers but we consider this to be a very worthwhile exercise as it helps us to work together more effectively.


Attendance News
