Focus on Excellence

In Year 6 this half term, our topic theme is Past and Present Greece. We have been so busy: writing a non-chronological report informing people of how the ancient Greeks lived; creating persuasive leaflets encouraging people to visit Crete; studying the ancient Greek myths and legends and learning the order of events in the ancient Greek era. During a creative arts session, we used mime and movements to retell the story of Theseus and the Minotaur, we then used drama techniques to act out this event as a news report. Following this, we are currently planning a newspaper report on King Minos and King Aegeus's decision to feed fourteen children to the Minotaur. This is just a sample of our engaging work in Year 6 with more exciting opportunities planned for the weeks ahead.
