Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a week of important announcements and various authorities have been considering their positions and updating their guidance to schools. We were all hoping the national data pertaining to Covid 19 would allow us to relax restrictions further from 21st June but sadly, the reality is that we need to hold our current position until the end of term.

Plans we were developing to support transition and for more social end of term events now need to be reconsidered and we have been advised to manage our end of year contacts remotely wherever possible. We will look again at our transition plans in the next couple of weeks and our plans to hold our amazing Woodfest Celebration will hopefully be reinstated in the autumn term.

As frustrating as this for all of us, I do understand the decision to err on the side of caution for the sake of a few more weeks. Positive case numbers have increased again and we do need to continue to be careful until the vast majority of the population are vaccinated. Local case rates continue to be low in Warwick but there have been some class closures in Warwickshire schools, so the local authority are understandably advocating a cautious, careful conclusion to the school year.

In more positive news, the quality of the children's work continues to rapidly improve and the children across the school are super-motivated. There has been a massive push to improve the accuracy and quality of the children's written recording and I have been handing out pen licenses for excellent work in all directions. Subject leaders and governors are working together in the next couple of weeks to look in detail at the standard of the children's work and we will be reporting some of the highlights in the weeks ahead.
