It's been another busy and exciting week. A huge well done to Year 4 who showcased their learning this week during their year group assembly. They performed really well and we all really enjoyed watching. Thank you so much to the many parents / carers who came to watch.

Our Curriculum Leader, Mrs Barlow, has enjoyed diving into aspects of our school curriculum right across the school this week. A Deep Dive involves looking at a variety of aspects of our curriculum delivery. Firstly we consider the 'intent'. We ask what skills and knowledge we want the children to learn and achieve and how is the learning is sequenced. Then we look at the 'implementation' and check the coverage across all of the year groups and that it is linked to prior learning. The 'impact' on learning is also evaluated. We ask 'how well are the pupils doing and what progress are they making'? At Woodloes, a Deep Dive is carried out by Mrs Barlow and the subject leader and involves all members of the school team through interviews with pupils, teachers and subject leaders, planning and work trawls and lesson visits. We are pleased to say that this week we have carried out two deep dives linked to PSHE and Reading and are very pleased with our findings.

# **Health & Safety**

As you know, we do mention in newsletters about parking/driving issues outside our school which, unfortunately, is an ongoing issue (as it is for most schools). As a school, we do not have any jurisdiction on parents/carers inappropriate parking/driving outside our school and are therefore limited as to what we can do, other than making requests for parents/carers to park/drive considerately and within the law. ### Medication

We do, subject to completion of necessary consent form(s), give medication in school to pupils (*if it has to be given during school hours*). Wherever possible, we do try and adhere to requested timescales. However, this is not always possible and, there are occasions where we are not able to give the medication at the requested time(s) and, in these instances, will give it as close to the required time as we can. Very occasionally, it may get missed altogether. These instances are not very common, but can happen, depending upon other circumstances in school. Please bear this in mind when completing medication consent form(s).
