
## **Attendance News**

Charles Dodgson, born1832 to 1898, better known by his pen name Lewis Carroll, was the author of 'Alice's Adventures in Wonderland', its sequel 'Through the looking glass' and many poems.

He was also a mathematician and lectured at Christ Church College Oxford, where he worked predominately in the field of mathematical logic

## Year 4




## **Puzzles and More**
