Dear Parents and Carers,

One of the many things I love about being a Head Teacher is the incredible variety of my role. On any given day, I can be supporting families, attending meetings, planning exciting school projects or helping children to get the tricky foil lid off their yoghurt at lunchtime: in short, it is never dull!

It is during my mid-day supervisor sessions that I get the opportunity to see what the children are eating and the contents of the children's lunchboxes are varied in their nutritional value. I know that preparing a lunchbox can be another job that adds to an already long list as a parent and sometimes we just want to throw some stuff in there that they might eat. I also accept that on some days it is easier to put together a healthier lunchbox than on others and that this might 'even things out' a bit over time. However, I have noticed that an increasing number of children are bringing in packed lunches that contain sweets, chocolate, chocolate spread sandwiches and other items that are high in sugar content. I have also noticed children fetching chocolate or sweets out of their packed lunch for a playtime snack which also adds to the litter that we have on site.

This weekend, could I invite you to discuss this with your children and possibly include a few more healthy options in your packed lunches next week- it would be great if we can make some positive changes to some of our children's eating habits.
