Dear Parents and Carers,

One of the many things I love about my role is the work I do with School Council and this week we have done a whole school assembly together and had a meeting today to consider the progress we have made this term and what we might do next. As ever, the children's ideas and observations of the school were fascinating and compel-

We talked in assembly on Monday about democratic processes, using our School Council as a practical example of this, 'British value in action'. It is fair to say that everyone was a little rusty talking about British values and this will be a focus for our assemblies in the spring term.

Our litter picking project, that has been running this term, is the first part of a wider 'Pupil Experiences Project' which has had a focus on 'Being Aware' i.e being more aware of our community, the environment etc... The next part of the project will have a focus on 'Being Respectful' and we will be developing a project with School Council in the spring term to bring this to life. More details to follow...

Additionally, we have talked about behaviour, safety and the curriculum and they have told me (and given examples) of things that have improved during the Autumn term, as well as some things that still need to get better. I love the honesty and candour of these conversations and the feedback they provide is an essential part of our strategic planning for the school. 
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Focus on Excellence


Woodloes Winter Wonderland
