Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the first newsletter of 2022 - I hope you have all made a fantastic start to the new year! We started our week with a whole school assembly on TEAMs. We are continuing to meet in this way to reduce the risk of transmission by keeping all of our classes separate. We have held meetings like this for a while now and have become adept at discussing whole school issues and staying connected, even though the children remain in their own classrooms.

This week we chatted about how we can improve our school environment and the children spoke about the amount of litter we produce which sometimes blows out of the bins and around the playground. We have litter picking teams, who do a great job, but we also agreed to try to reduce the number of packets and wrappers we bring to school to see whether this would also help. If you could possibly consider this when you are providing snacks for the children, that would be great and hopefully with your help we can make a big improvement.

This afternoon has also seen the first achievement assemblies of the year. We do these in year group bubbles at the moment which allows us to celebrate the children's achievements together in safe working groups. It was lovely spending some time with Year 1, 2 and 3 and I thoroughly enjoyed chatting with the children about all the great things they have been doing.

Finally, we have received further guidance today from the DfE about further changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for COVID-19. In summary, they confirmed that from Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

It is inevitable that the guidance will evolve in response to changing circumstances and we will continue to update you with the information we receive and the implications this will have for our school.


