Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back and happy new year to everyone! On behalf of all the staff, I would also like to thank you for any Christmas cards or gifts: your wonderful generosity brought lots of smiles to faces and happiness at the end of term!

The children have settled wonderfully well and we spoke about new years resolutions and new beginnings in assembly this week. We have all agreed that we are going to focus on kindness and respect and to think of something nice to say or do for someone else every day: I hope you notice this at home too.

We are starting the new year with some exciting new developments. We are launching a new behaviour management programme and a copy of the policy is available on our website (new website coming soon). The programme is based on promoting and acknowledging good behaviour but also has a staged approach of sanctions to address any inappropriate behaviour. Our children are amazing and the behaviour at our school is fantastic overall but we do want to continue to make improvements and we are confident that the new programme will have a positive impact where required.

We are also launching a new lunchtime model next week after months of research, discussion and planning. Every minute of the time our children spend at school should be a positive experience where they have opportunities to enjoy themselves and learn: the changes we are making to the structure and timings are designed to facilitate this intent. It has been very carefully considered and it will be explained in detail to the children on Monday morning so they understand the new expectations and hopefully, there won't be too many bumps in the road!

I look forward to reporting on the impact of these new initiatives in the weeks to come.

Highest class attendance for last week—Class 2T (Tresadern) with 99.3%!


Whole school attendance to date - 96.1% (school target 96.5%)
