Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been lovely to see how well the children have settled back into good routines this week. They have returned calmly and sensibly and have quickly settled to their learning. In our assembly this week (on Teams) the children collectively identified things we should focus on this term and we produced a whole school, summer term agreement. This includes, kindness and respect, working hard, behaving well, being nice and being a good friend! It was a fantastic discussion that showed great maturity from all of our children, which is something we have come to expect, but not take for granted, at Woodloes.

The new Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, has, this week, launched The Big Ask - the largest ever consultation with children aged 4 to 17 in England. It aims to find out children's concerns and aspirations about the future, so that we can put children at the heart of our country's recovery from the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. Parents, care leavers and those working with children are also invited to complete the adult survey to share their views about the future for children and young people today and what they think is holding young people back.

The results from this survey will help the Children's Commissioner identify the barriers preventing children from reaching their potential, put forward solutions and set ambitious goals for the country to achieve and I would certainly encourage everyone to participate if they can.

We also had a visit today from Philip Hamilton, the CEO of the Community Academies Trust and he was full of praise for the school, commenting that a visit to Woodloes always leaves him feeling 'energised'.
