Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the end of the spring term, if your child is in Year 1 to Year 6 you will be receiving a written progress report. The reports provide helpful information about your child's attainment and progress in Reading, Writing, GPS and Maths with recommendations about next steps in their learning journey. The reports also identify how you might be able to support your child at home too which hopefully ensure that we are working together to ensure your children make the best possible progress. If your child's report raises any further questions for you then please make contact with your child's class teacher and they will be happy to help.

On a day when the BBC are reporting 4.9 million people with Covid-19 this week, we have received further guidance from the LA regarding the government's 'Living with Covid' plan. The main headlines are:

Symptomatic and asymptomatic testing (PCR and LFT) will cease for the majority of the population. People with respiratory symptoms (including COVID-19 symptoms) should stay at home, avoid contact with others and return to normal activities when well enough and don't have a temperature. For schools and early years settings this means that children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

It will be interesting to see how the next few weeks evolve and we will continue to be vigilant and monitor the situation carefully.
