



Dear Parents and carers,

I wrote to you all yesterday about the escalating Coronavirus situation. Immediately following my letter, the decision was taken to close schools and colleges in the Republic of Ireland but the UK government reiterated their decision and rationale for keeping schools and colleges open in the UK.

We continue to receive daily updates and increasingly the information we receive in the morning is being revised by the time we go home and I suspect there is going to be more of that in the weeks ahead. We will continue to act upon the advice and guidance we receive to ensure we play our part to keep the children, staff and our community as safe as possible.

There is a lot of information around to guide our response to the virus and some of the links you might find helpful can be found in yesterday's letter. In addition to that, there are a couple of clarifications you might find useful:

1. If your child develops a continuous cough or has a temperature (37.8 degrees or above) then you should call NHS 111 who could advise you to self-isolate for 7 days. If this is the case then please inform the school and we will code this absence accordingly.
2. If you have been advised to self-isolate one of your children but your other children show no symptoms then the advice we have received is that they can continue to attend school.

In other non-Corona-news, I was delighted by the Year 1 curriculum assembly which showcased their excellent work and a very positive attitude to learning and for the rest of the school it is brilliant, business as usual.
