Dear Parents and Carers,

The children have had another good week this week and are taking positive steps forward academically and in terms of their overall approach to their learning. Focus on Excellence

Year 4's topic this half term is flotsam and coasts based on the lovely picture book Flotsam by David Weisner. We have been exploring a range of writing genres in our English. We described an underwater cartoon world using amazing detail to make it come to life for the reader. We wrote poems personifying the sea and giving it human characteristics; we had the sea eating the sand for breakfast, playing with the children in the surf, raging in anger, drooling over the smell of food, crying and waving at the beach.

We have also done some beautiful art work sketching real life flotsam and shells as well as painting with texture adding sand to our paint and using cotton wool and sticks to create lines in the waves and puffy clouds. We have been learning about coastal features in geography too - let's hope we get the chance to spot some of them this summer!
