Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have all had a good week. It has been difficult to watch the escalation in Ukraine and to not feel the impact of this at home and in school. We have continued to support our children if they have shown any concern and we have revisited strategies for seeking support if anyone feels anxious or worried.

Research and professional advice suggests we should maintain good, positive routines and we are keeping a good balance of academic challenge and fun across the school.

We will continue to monitor the situation closely and respond accordingly.

Have you noticed how bad the traffic is at the moment?!?

There are roadworks everywhere and this is causing long delays especially in the morning which has the potential to make people late to work and school. I don't know how long this will be an issue but we might need to leave a bit earlier to ensure we can all get to where we need to be on time.

The relaxation of Covid regulations and general settling down of positive case numbers in our school community means that we can start to make some positive changes to our school operations. So, from next Monday, we will resume assemblies in the hall with Year 1, 2 and 3 meeting together with Year 4, 5 and 6 meeting in a second group together, which allows for a certain amount of 'distancing'. Additionally, we would like to invite parents to attend Achievement assemblies again too, which is a really positive step for us all. The all had so much fun and learnt about seeing both sides of an argument. Well done Year 6's!




Other News
