Today you are going to write a paragraph describing your Dragon character

- ► The Dragon you designed yesterday will be part of your Viking story next week.
- We will write a paragraph to describe the dragon character today which you can then use in your story to introduce the reader to your dragon.
- You need to think about the FAB characteristics, making sure you describe your characters feelings, appearance and behaviour to the reader. The behaviour should show the feelings of the character (breathing fire angrily/ swooping through the clouds with his Viking partner on his back)
- Your reader should find out what the dragon looks like, how it behaves and what sort of dragon it is after reading your description.

You can also include some of the sentence types we did on Friday
