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| Lesson type | Teach |
| Lesson focus | Words ending in the $/ \mathrm{g} /$ sound spelt '-gue' and the $/ \mathrm{k} /$ sound spelt 'que' <br> (French in origin) |
| Resources needed | Spelling journals |
| Teaching activity | Share the following words on the board: <br> fatigue <br> catalogue <br> What do pupils notice about the /g/ sound? <br> Divide the polysyllabic words into syllables and draw a box for each syllable on <br> the board. <br> Syllabify the words and write each syllable in the boxes. <br> Which syllables are tricky? How will pupils remember these? Repeat with antique <br> and unique. <br> Ask pupils to Quickwrite one word of each pattern for one minute. |
