What are inverted commas?

Inverted commas are punctuation marks that show the reader that a character has spoken. They are commas that are sometimes inverted (turned upside down) and reversed to go around the spoken words or dialogue.

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WAGOLL:

- 1. Put "around the words the speaker says
- 2. Start the speech with a CL after the " (even if the speech is in the middle of a sentence)
- 3. Include punctuation before every "
- 4. Check there is a ? or ! at the end of every sentence
- 5. Separate the <u>words that are said</u> from <u>who is speaking</u> with a , (unless there is already a ? or an !)
- 6. Start a new paragraph when a different speaker says something NSNL

Mrs Green said, "This was fascinating."



"Where is my skipping rope?" asked Lily.

Lily asked, "Where is my skipping rope?"
