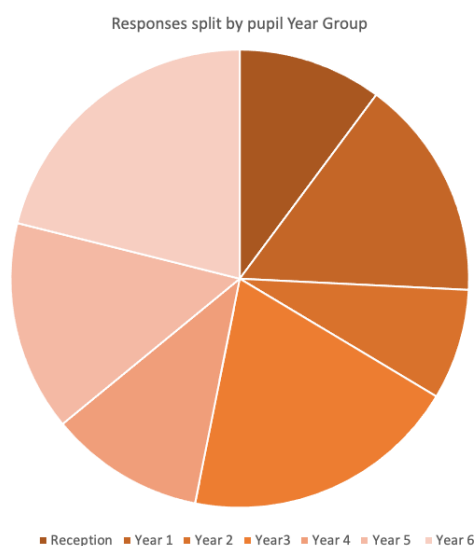


Woodloes Primary School Remote Education Survey Feedback

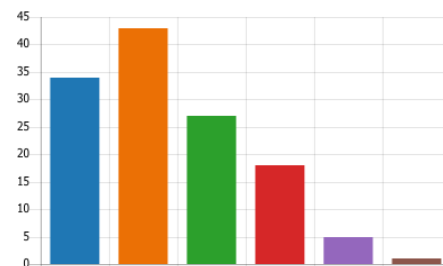
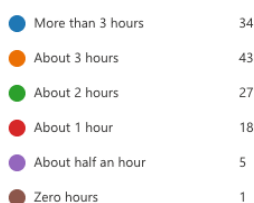
Thank you for taking the time to complete the Remote Education survey sent out in March 2021.

We had a fantastic response with 128 people completing the survey and all year groups represented.

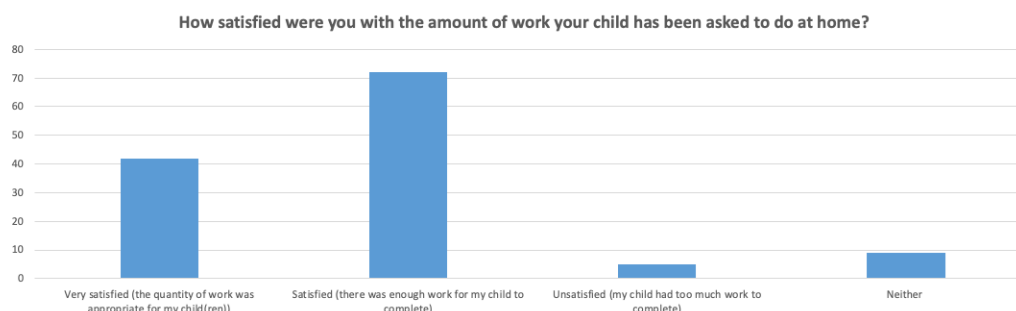
Below is a snapshot summary of the results of the survey. These results have been reviewed by the leadership team at school and by the School Standards Committee and will inform any future work around remote education.



What is the average amount of time that your child spent on work set by their teacher each day (excluding live lessons)?



89% respondents satisfied or very satisfied with the amount of work set to do at home



What has the school done well during lockdown?

- "Supporting children and keeping mood levels high."
- "Doing work packs for us to collect to help my child more with his work "
- "Our school has been fantastic from the start. I am very proud that my children are lucky enough to attend this school. As always Mr Mitchell and the team never give in. I am very grateful for them and appreciate everything they have done throughout. "
- "Continual communication. The contact with the teacher everyday has encouraged my child and given them at least some connection to the school community."
- "daily live lessons have made a huge difference, compared to March - June 2020. Gives structure in the morning (get dressed, finish breakfast). Kids love seeing their teacher. The recorded lessons were also great. The teacher offered to have a private call with our daughter, which she really enjoyed."
- "A good balance between having some live teaching, but flexibility to do great of learning with parental support. At age 6, would be too much to be online with live lessons for more than we had"

Respondents in the main experienced barriers at home which affected their ability to learn at home

Nonetheless, there was satisfaction with the work set

Woodloes has an excellent foundation to build on in the event of a future shift to whole or partial limitations to on site teaching

Overall, how satisfied are you with the remote education that has been provided in January and February?

Very satisfied	64

Recommendations

- Woodloes is a very diverse community – some households felt the work was too much, others wanted more. **Any future communication regarding this will reinforce reminders that the school is balancing a wide ranges of needs for a wide range of situations**
- Some parents have suggested small enhancements which are easily actionable. **Teaching staff should include page numbering on any printable materials and give a weekly overview of the online lesson content to support at home planning**
- **A consistent and proportionate approach to child-specific feedback will be introduced**
- A mix of devices have been used including borrowed Chromebooks and hard copy materials provided by the school. **A cycle of periodic surveying may be used to understand what resources would be needed to support future at home learning – a live view of needs will enhance the school's ability to quickly support its pupils should the need for closures arise in the future.**

Again, thank you for taking the time for engaging with this survey and our Remote Education learning offer. Your feedback and collaboration is essential to the continual development of the school.
